**Changes to Advertising Charges** The Committee regrets but it is necessary for us to increase our advertising charges so that we can meet our printing costs – this is the first increase since 2018. #### Jubilee Field almost 45 years young by Neil Burden

As we rapidly approach the celebrations of the Queens Platinum Jubilee, this article is a record of how we celebrated Queen Elizabeth II's Silver Jubilee in 1977 by purchasing the field to the east of Trekenner School. This field was formerly owned by the Raddall family of Fleardon and known as Lezant Cricket Field – when the parish had its own cricket team before the 2<sup>nd</sup> World War. We were approached by the new landowner, Mr Harold Goodman, around 1975 after the planners stated it was not suitable for housing development. This was when the 6 bungalows had been built adjoining in a small 3 cornered field. The total cost would be about £2K - this is when farmland was priced at £300 per acre and a new bungalow in the parish could be bought for £5K. Even so this was an opportunity not to be missed.

The Parish Council fortuitously were a step ahead to this offer when ClIr Enid Tregoning was Chairperson of the Parish Council (1971-1975). Local people knew there were some funds lying somewhere gathering dust in a deposit bank account called the Lezant Village Hall Fund, earning only little interest, with just one surviving trustee. ClIr Tregoning with the support of the then Parish Council and the additional help of Audrey Parsons, the Parish Clerk, were keen to get this money released. At that time I was Vice Chairman of the Parish Council and was detailed to see what could be done. So, I went and knocked on the door of the sole remaining trustee!!

In those post war years of the early 1950's, there had been much enthusiasm in raising money to build a Parish Hall which several other local parishes were also doing. Money raising events were held in the field at Homelands. I can just remember the coconut shy in the tin hay shed and a huge bonfire which my father oversaw. An elderly gentleman had the honour of lighting the bonfire, no doubt assisted by diesel or even petrol, as the flames flared up he fell forward and my father grabbed him as he was literately nearly roasted - what is called a close shave or singe!

With much enthusiasm the fund grew rapidly, some parishioners wanted to start building as soon as possible, however the Parish Hall Building Fund Committee were divided, so much so there was a standoff. In the end a compromise was reached that the funds be divided between those that wanted to do something immediately on a smaller scale to refresh/rebuild the Men's Institute at Treburley and the remaining half of about £1300 pounds to be held in a deposit bank account. This, as you can imagine, deflated the energy of further money raising events.

We also discovered on investigation no returns had been made for several years to the Charity Commission and there was just one surviving trustee, a local solicitor, Harry Godwin who lived at Homelands. So with the support of the Charity Commission this was an open door. Mr Godwin was somewhat embarrassed and realised the illegality of no annual returns for several years and also the Charity commission said a single Trustee was illegal. Sadly there was no means to appoint new trustees so the money had to be released into the care of the Parish Council to be used for the benefit of the parish.

At that time interest rates were very high and the money was invested for some eighteen months, which helped increase the Fund and we were able to purchase the field at the asking price for the Parish with the shortfall made up from the Parish Council Account.

During that time I had become the Parish Council Chairman 1975-1979. Everything was in place to officially open the field in 1977 on the same day as the nation celebrated the Queen's Silver Jubilee. This was a very successful event when most of the parish took part with inter-village knock out competitions, Jubilee mugs for all the children, a free tea, a Church Service and the planting of the oak tree by the school children opposite the War Memorial at Landue. This was planted on the former A388 road. A digger operative dug down about 14 feet through the tarmac and stone base of the former road so the tree would survive, even though Mr Tregoning said single oak trees look like cabbages! Always bearing those comments in mind, we are hoping that, with some management, it will grow nice and tall.

A new trust was then appointed under the guidance of the Charity Commission. The Chair and Vice Chair of the Trust being in perpetuity the current Chair and Vice Chair of the Parish Council, plus three local worthies. The first were Mrs Mary Bennett, Denis Coumbe and Roy Rowe. Whenever there was a vacancy, the Trust appointed another trustee. The Trustees hold no funds and meet twice a year but still need to approve any changes to the Field. Whilst the day to day running of Jubilee Field has been delegated to the Parish Council, the School has sole use of it during school hours with the proviso that it keeps the area clean and tidy and the grass cut. The present Trustees are the Parish Chairman and Vice Chairman, Cllr Val Hill and Cllr Julie Denis, with Cindy Wills, Rosamund Thomas and Ian Nash. The field is central to the Parish and any organisation who would like to use this facility for a public event need to prebook the date with the Parish Clerk.

**Note from the editor:** On the 5th September the Jubilee Field will play host to a Parish Community Picnic—a chance for all ages to come together after a very difficult 18 months. Tables and seating will be provided or bring a rug if you prefer. For more details please see the poster on the next page or call Jill Brown on 01579 370910. As has been well publicised in both the local and national media recently the hospitality industry is suffering a severe shortage of restaurant staff and chefs. Here at Tre, Pol & Pen we are not exempt from this problem and as many of you are aware we have been trying to run with a reduced menu on three days a week.

Having reviewed our operations over the past few weeks, a decision has been taken to temporarily close the restaurant on two days of the week in order to provide a better service to you for the remaining five days. Therefore, from Monday 26<sup>th</sup> July the restaurant will be completely closed on Mondays and Tuesdays. We will be open Wednesday to Sunday, when we will continue to offer fresh, locally sourced food including our Sunday roasts, cooked with care and attention by the team. Although our butchery and delicatessen counter are both closed on a Sunday we have a range of items available that the staff have prepared and prepacked for you. Please ask a member of staff if you need assistance.

As a team, we are passionate about serving good quality food in a safe, welcoming environment and everyone here has strived to achieve that. We appreciate there have been times when we have been extremely stretched and hope that the decision to close for two days a week will ensure we continue to offer the best we can for the rest of the week.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank the local community for your support through what has been a challenging few months since we re-opened and appreciate your understanding of the need to temporarily change our hours.

# PARISH TAXI SCHEME

### FOR RESIDENTS OF LEZANT PARISH ONLY

The parish council subsidy for the taxi scheme is now £4 per trip, **return £4 each way**. The fares charged by Launceston Taxis are as below. **As a resident of Lezant Parish**, you are entitled to a subsidy of £4.00 for any taxi journey at any time, so long as a taxi is available. To take advantage of the scheme the taxi must be prebooked through Launceston Taxis on 07340 813434. The taxi driver will have a form that he will complete. You sign the form and pay the reduced rate to the driver. Please note that the single fares quoted below are for guidance only, if you live outside one of the villages the fare may differ slightly:

Lezant £9.00	Subsidy £4.00	You pay £5.00
Tregada £9.00		You pay £5.00
Trekenner £10.00		You pay £6.00
Trekelland £9.00		You pay £5.00
Trebullett £10.00		You pay £6.00
Treburley £10.00		You pay £6.00
Rezare £10.50		You pay £6.50

For example, a return journey from Treburley to Launceston will cost £12 in total. The Parish Council would encourage all residents to use the taxi whenever possible although it is appreciated that a taxi is not always available. Pre-booking the day before can sometimes help. **Remember**, the taxi cannot be used on a regular basis for commuting between home and work, nor as a school-run vehicle.



The Gardening Gang...

Happy August.....and wowzers, how the plants have grown (particularly the weeds, but why ruin a great conversation).

Remember to keep feeding your plants and borders and dead head in earnest as the plants need this to generate more flowers – greatly beneficial to roses. You can carry on planting shrubs and trees but try and stick to container grown plants and water well throughout the summer. Although it is said that it is best to hold off planting now until the autumn, as you know we live in one of the wettest places in the UK (take that exacting statistic with a pinch of salt, but Gary will tell you it is) so plants *should* have good moist conditions to settle in well. But if you are going away get someone in to cover the watering for you.

Hardy annuals and biennials should be doing well now. Remember to feed, weed, stake and water! We drum the mantra of water, water, water into our customers when trying to establish plants. Keep mowing the lawn, feed and weed and keep reseeding when you have chance. However, leave trees alone now but if you require some work to them in the autumn get a quote and book it in now - tree surgeons get very busy at the end of the summer. Also, don't forget to keep an eye on ponds and fish, making sure water levels don't drop and keeping pond weed down. We are about to create a brook from a buried watercourse in our back garden and will keep you updated on how we design and create a wonderful wildlife haven.

For all those interested in wildlife, South Bosent, out near Dobwalls, is holding its open garden event on the 22<sup>nd</sup> August. It is a paid entry event, but you have 9 acres of wildlife heaven to explore, including ponds and woodlands. 




