Gentlemen of the Road, Roadsters, Tramps by Neil Burden September 2021

When I was a schoolboy in the 50's, a familiar sight was to meet or see a man carrying a strange bundle of possessions tied up with string and walking along our lanes. At that time people called them Gentleman of the Road or Tramp or Roadster. Trebullett was on a direct route when travelling from the Workhouse at Liskeard to St Mary's, the Workhouse at Launceston, now demolished and where Tesco's is now. The Workhouse took in people for the night who had no fixed lodgings and, if able, they were required to break so many stones and pass them through a grid as a contribution for their night's stay.

Most of these Tramps were known to local people, having descended from local families, and they would often put their head down in any barn or shed enroute, often in the 4 vacated ruined miners' cottages at the bottom of Trebullett Hill where now only snowdrops mark the spot. This direct route from Liskeard to Launceston was but a stone rolled lane and not metalled until the 1960's and, being frequented by Tramps and with a poor surface, was rarely used by people with cars, and cyclists rarely used it, even to cycle to the Grammar Schools of Horwell and Dunheved College.

Both my parents lived near Trebullett and attended those two schools, yet always cycled each day in the 1930's via Lezant and the A388. Being such a no-go road was so engrained that my father rarely ever used that road except when we went to the Launceston Annual Horse Show at Hurdon Farm on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday in July in our Austin Seven. I have memories of one 'Gentleman of the Road' called Heber Pethick, a man of large frame, with a long ginger beard, a cousin of my Grandmother Nellie Burden. He was from a Launceston family with many siblings and, as they say, 'took to drink'. He was also known to take on the challenge as a wrestler/boxer at the travelling fairs. When he came knocking on our door Mum and Dad would always give him some food and say he could sleep in a barn but forfeit his matches until the next morning. I remember Dad was cross as one night he slept near a rat run and was sick – no doubt also eating his food too fast, often a big farmhouse pasty and a lump of saffron cake with a jug of tea.

On another most memorable occasion, he came knocking the door at Sunday dinner time. Bernard, my friend, had come to lunch as was our custom after morning service and Heber joined us, sitting at the long kitchen table on the window bench with Bernard and myself alongside him. He was very mannerly, said Amen after the grace was said and then he took salt on the small spoon from the saltcellar and with his clean knife gently tapped the spoon over his roast meal. We were agog as we had never seen anyone do that as people would just put a little pile of salt on the side of their plate. Almost as soon as he finished his lunch he fell asleep, still sat at the table. We went out to play and then Sunday school at 2.30pm and when I came home he had returned to his travels.

Cracking stone for road repairs was also a paid job and a certain quantity was expected for each day's work. Just at the top of the road going from Trebullett to Larrick was what my Father always referred to as 'the stone heap' (now a vehicle passing layby) where large stone from a cart would be tipped and men employed to break up these stones. Each piece of broken stone had to pass through a sizing mesh grid about 2/3 inches square for road repairs. One of the last employees hired by the local authority for this task was Mr Claude Olver, who with his wife sometime later ran Trebullett Post Officer and delivered our mail on foot.

ing her friendly self to all. Our Joint Secretary, Rosemary Buckler, has also left the Group as she and her husband have moved away to be nearer their family. Two new Committee members were appointed – we welcome Julie Dinnis as our Programme Secretary and Carolyn Reynolds as our Minute Secretary. We welcome them to our Committee to join Mary Crew, Chair, and Jill Price, Treasurer.

Our Group's summer started with visits to Lewtrenchard Manor Gardens in June, to South Hill View's Summer Garden in July and in August we visited both Anvil Cottage and Windmills. All our visits were well attended and enjoyed, especially the last two where we may revisit at a different time of year in future. Unfortunately, our September meeting had to be cancelled as the proposed speaker was unable to attend but we look forward to hearing Robin Hill on 20<sup>th</sup> October who will tell us about The Beauty of Leaves. The meeting starts at 7.30pm in Lezant Church Room. Our November meeting will be a workshop at Trebullett Hall, led by Louise Trenerry. This will be with a Christmas Theme. The date is 17<sup>th</sup> November so please put this in your diary. *Visitors are welcome to all our meetings.*

## PARISH TAXI SCHEME FOR RESIDENTS OF LEZANT PARISH ONLY

The parish council subsidy for the taxi scheme is now £4 per trip, **return £4 each way**. The fares charged by Launceston Taxis are as below. **As a resident of Lezant Parish**, you are entitled to a subsidy of £4.00 for any taxi journey at any time, so long as a taxi is available. To take advantage of the scheme the taxi must be prebooked through Launceston Taxis on 07340 813434. The taxi driver will have a form that he will complete. You sign the form and pay the reduced rate to the driver. Please note that the single fares quoted below are for guidance only, if you live outside one of the villages the fare may differ slightly:

Lezant £9.00	Subsidy £4.00	You pay £5.00
Tregada £9.00		You pay £5.00
Trekenner £10.00		You pay £6.00
Trekelland £9.00		You pay £5.00
Trebullett £10.00		You pay £6.00
Treburley £10.00		You pay £6.00
Rezare £10.50		You pay £6.50

For example, a return journey from Treburley to Launceston will cost £12 in total. The Parish Council would encourage all residents to use the taxi whenever possible although it is appreciated that a taxi is not always available. Pre-booking the day before can sometimes help. **Remember**, the taxi cannot be used on a regular basis for commuting between home and work, nor as a school-run vehicle.

### It can't be that difficult, can it? Tim Slater

Like many town boys (and some girls), I always had an urge to drive a tractor and make my mark across the countryside. When in 1968 I married a farmer's daughter, (Liz Raymont), whose family farmed Trenute in Trebullett, my ambition became more likely to be realised. Like any good son-in-law I was anxious to prove that even a schoolteacher on holiday can be useful on the farm. I mended fences, fed the horses, planted trees, chauffeured sheep to the abattoir and held the bottom of ladders while Something Important happened at the top. Then, one day George Raymont, my father in law, asked me to help him with the roller on his Trekenner fields.

On the old grey Ferguson tractor I followed him down the lanes, while mere cars and dog-walkers cowered against the steep banks. In the fields I was introduced to the roller – a magnificent solid cylinder of polished granite with short metal axles protruding from each end, which then turned in greased wooden bearings (apple wood?). It was all mounted on an iron frame. A few instructions about fixing my eyes on some feature on the far end of the field and I was off – being USEFUL at last.

With about half the field done, I was aware that George was waving and looking agitated. It seemed that shortly after starting the latest strip, I had shed the roller and had continued on dragging just the iron frame behind me. One of the wooden bearings had split and although we lashed it up (with binder twine?), my rolling was over. Worse still, George said he would be embarrassed to let neighbours see the mess we had made (from distant hill tops with binoculars?) and he harrowed over my nice rolled lines!

As dusk began to fall, Liz came out with the car to escort us home, as the tractors' headlights were not reliable. In the shadow of the lanes there was a sudden flare of light as the grease round George's exhaust pipe caught fire. Calmly he took off his cap and swatted the flames out. He then replaced his cap, soot and all, making himself look like a commando camouflaged for a night raid!

Despite his irrepressible optimism, I do not think he called the day's activities a "proper job", but as we parked the tractors in the yard, I do think he said kindly, as he usually did, "That'll do nicely, boy". However, I was not invited to drive a

# Have a Green Halloween!

The scariest thing about Halloween is the plastic waste It is estimated that 2,000 tons of plastic waste are generated from "disposable" Halloween costumes each year, that's the equivalent of 83 million plastic bottles. In the UK, 40% of costumes are only worn once resulting in 7 million being thrown away in the same period. In Cornwall, we throw away 125 tonnes of Halloween outfits each year and generate 290 tonnes of extra rubbish in the week before, the week of, and the week after Halloween.

Nightmarish food waste In Cornwall we buy 225,000 pumpkins but a frightful 70% are never eaten. That's 157,500 pumpkins binned in Cornwall alone and 180 tonnes of pumpkin flesh clogging our waste system. In the UK, a whopping 18,000 tonnes of pumpkin are thrown away each year, that's the same as 360 million portions of pumpkin pie. This year use the pumpkin flesh and make a pumpkin soup or pie.

Scary stats The average annual household rubbish weighs 963kg. In the average rubbish bag 35% is food, 22% is recyclable and 45% is rubbish. If everyone recycled the 22% that is recyclable in rubbish bags, then 1 in 5 dust carts could be taken off the road.

#### Lezant W I

As with so many WI's, and with the added technical help of Jo Rider, we enjoyed experiencing virtual zoom meetings moving from a virtual coffee and chat at home to a quiz with Irene Nash over the past months. Then, as most members developed the skill of using zoom, we had a virtual talk on the history of Kit Hill by Chrissie le Marchant who enthralled us on the subject.

Lezant WI has since been delighted to now meet in person, when the first meeting was to 'Chairs 'by kind invitation of Alice Brown who, on one of those extremely hot afternoons, gave a tour of the premises and history of many of her chairs, then challenged members to a quiz on what they had seen. Being the 95<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Lezant WI a celebratory cake was then shared.



For the September meeting, Michael Stephens was the speaker on 'The World in our Gardens '. He explained that 95 % of our plants originate from abroad, a surprisingly high number. We were treated to a quick world tour showing where many species came from. There was great enthusiasm for worldwide plant collecting in Victorian Times from the big estates in Cornwall, an example being Rhododendrons from the foothill of the Himalayas and, when David Douglas explored the United States, he brought back the fir, now known as the Douglas fir as many species were named after the person who found them. Plant collectors such as he led varied and exciting lives, often dangerous, some meeting very grisly fates. Herbs were often from the Mediterranean. Dahlias were firstly brought back as a food crop, not to everyone's taste, before realising their beauty when they became a popular garden flower. Camellias from Asia, the source of tea leaves dried to make our daily cuppa, the tea plant now successfully grown at Trewithen. He told us about many others, discussing the value of these species to wildlife or otherwise, before going on to mention some invasive plants, such as the well-known Japanese Knotweed, which was imported in the 1840's as an ornamental plant and won 1<sup>st</sup> prize for the most interesting plant of the year. Other invasive plants are the Himalayan Balsam and even Montbretia. Being an island, Great Britain has relatively few native plant species. The primrose and honeysuckle are two of these, also the wild narcissi.

Julie Dinnis gave the vote of thanks for this interesting talk. For the autumn months it has been agreed to meet again at Trebullett Hall due to the bigger space and ability to distance better there. The next meeting will be on Wed 13<sup>th</sup> Oct at 7.30pm, everyone welcome.

#### Awareness on the Lanes by Jill Brown, Trekenner

Having recently adopted a blind rescue dog, I am concerned about the speed our local residents (as well as courier drivers) drive on our single track country roads especially at this time of year when the hedgerows reduce the width of our country roads. I know that horse riders also feel vulnerable on the lanes. In early September on the road from Trebullett to Trekenner, a motorist accelerated as he was entering the bend. At that point I could not see the car but heard his loud vehicle changing gear, moved over to the side of the road and held out my hand by about 35 cm so the motorist would not spook my blind dog. The driver did break suddenly, cut his speed when he passed us, then accelerated at high speed ejecting oil and petrol fumes. Why??

As we approach the winter months, I would urge walkers on our country roads to wear hi-vis clothing to warn oncoming speeding traffic of their presence on the road and for us all to be aware that the A388 in our Parish is dangerous and we need to cut our speed when driving along this stretch of road as well as our lanes.
