RITA ROWE 5TH MAY 1925 TO 25TH AUGUST 2021

Rita May Rowe born on 5th May 1925 at 1, The Yews Treburley and where she returned to live in the last 20 years of her life. Before she was 2 she moved with her parents to a new bungalow on the farm at Walston near Rezare. In 1927, her brother, Roy, was born and 3 years later her brother Ivor. Rita grew up learning farm life, helping her Mum feed the poultry and collect eggs. When she was quite young she learnt to play the piano as her mother had done, this led to a lifelong love of music and song, with an amazing memory for lyrics. She attended Trekenner Primary school until she was 12 when her parents decided to send her to a girls' school, Gunnerside, in Plymouth. While there she lodged with an elderly couple known to the family, and returned home at weekends. Rita's education there was cut short when the school closed because of the impending effects of WW2.



Rita returned home and was encouraged by her parents to help in the office of her father's butchers shop in Devonport. She was not happy there and decided to apply for a job in the Civil Service in the Admiralty Office. She was successful and was posted to Royal William Yard in Devonport in the Victualling Department, helping to provision ships with vital supplies. As the effects of WW2 increased on Plymouth, it was decided to move the offices to Launceston in Dunheved Road. Rita was able to cycle to work each day with other friends from the Lezant area. When the war ended the offices returned to Devonport and Rita met many important members of the Admiralty who visited the offices, including Louis Mountbatten. She also began to explore hobbies there, getting involved in many play productions with the Royal Dockyard Players and, in recent years, the Plymouth Theatre Company. She organised several trips to the Devonport Playhouse which were enjoyed by many in the parish until this became a little too much due to her failing health. Rita's sense of adventure and ambition eventually made her decide to apply for posts in London. She gained a post in the Admiralty Office of the Ministry of Defence and found a flat of her own.

In the early 1950s, Rita applied and was accepted for a post in Madrid, Spain, somewhere she had always wanted to go. She really loved the Spanish way of life and even had Flamenco lessons, buying some much cherished castanets. While there she began to explore other parts of the country as well as travelling to Morocco. Her contract had been for three years but she was recalled to take up a new post as her experience was needed to set up offices in Beirut in the Lebanon. Although very disappointed not to be staying in Madrid, she took up the challenge of another country and its customs and soon made many friends including Emile Atiya, who she said had been the love of her life. Midway through 1958 she had to rush home after being told the sad news that her father had died in an accident on the farm. After spending some time at home supporting her mother, she then had to return to Beirut to continue her work. During her two years there she took more opportunities to explore parts of the country and also visited Jerusalem and Bethlehem. In the Holy Land, she collected some water from the river Jordan, which she brought back to be used for Rosamund's Christening in 1959. Returning to London to work again it wasn't long before she was offered another overseas post, this time in Bangkok, Thailand. Here she was to spend the next two years, learning to drive in a Series One Land Rover in the busy Bangkok streets. Exploring other parts of this country and Vietnam, Cambodia and Hong Kong were also part of her 2 years there. When the time came to return home, Rita decided to travel a different way. She flew to Honolulu in Hawaii before continuing to Arizona to meet her Uncle Jack and Auntie Bessie, her Mum's sister. Although there had been a lot of correspondence over the years, she had not met this part of the family and had a few wonderful weeks with them before flying back to London and home with many photos to show. Her American visit was the start of closer links with the family in Arizona who visited Cornwall twice after this. From then on, Rita continued her career in London, visiting naval vessels in port as part of her perks of the job. Eventually she moved from the Admiralty offices to Army Education services in the same building. The Admiralty was always her first love and Lord Nelson her hero. She enjoyed visiting museums, theatres and exhibitions and made many friends. She also took evening classes including upholstery and was able to recover some small pieces of furniture for her flat. Rita visited her dear Mother as often as she could and took her on holiday abroad for the first time to her favourite place, Madrid. They also had other holidays to Paris and Ireland. When Rita retired she was able to spend more time with her Mother, returning to stay in her flat in London to visit friends and attend events.

In 1997 Rita arranged a very special party for the 100th birthday of her dear mother. By this time, Mrs Rowe had become very frail and need much care. Rita fulfilled this need and stayed permanently with her. The party was a great success, attended by many family members and friends. Sadly the following year, Mrs Rowe died at the age of 101. Rita then moved from her childhood home at Walston to the cottage where she had been born and where she spent the last years of her life.

She kept her independence with her little car and visited friends and family, attending local events and places of interest. She started attending Trebulet chapel regularly, again making friends and enjoying the chapel's social events. She kept her flat in London and continued to travel there by bus for special events or to catch up with friends but, by the time she reached 90, she was finding this difficult because as her increasing dementia made her confused about travel times. Independence was now difficult and, after a spell in hospital she agreed to have carers to help her to continue to live at home. Unfortunately, in December 2018, she had a serious fall at home, breaking her upper thigh bone. An operation to repair this was successful but she was unable to walk again despite having physiotherapy so she then had to leave her cottage to be looked after in Pendrucombe Nursing home. Here she settled quite well in the caring kind environment. This last year saw a real decline in Rita's health and memory. Sadly she began to forget much of her amazing life and the people she met, although we were so lucky that she always remembered her family and her early life at Walston. She made an impression on everyone she met as a very interesting, independent and lovely lady who was always immaculately dressed. We are all fortunate to have known and loved her.

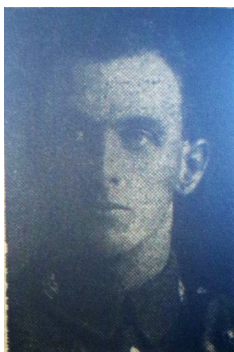

In Remembrance

Leonard Heywood Bray 1894-1915

An extract from *Launceston Then!*

Leonard was born in 1894 to Thomas and Emma Bray at Landue Mill, Lezant. His Father was an Agricultural Worker. By 1911 Thomas had passed away and the family had moved to Tredown Cottages, Lezant with Leonard working as a Farm Labourer. He enlisted at Holsworthy with the Royal North Devon Hussars Yeomanry as a Private with the 1/1st. The 1/1st were with the 2nd South Western Mounted Brigade, who in September 1915 left Colchester for Liverpool. On September 24th it boarded 'RMS Olympic' and sailed the next day. It arrived at Mudros on October 1st and then on to Suvla Bay. The regiment landed in Gallipoli on October 9th and was attached to the 11th (Northern) Division (*digging trenches*). In November it was in the firing line, attached to the 2nd Mounted Division and 53rd (Welsh) Infantry Division. It was during this November fighting that Leonard was killed in action on November 29th, 1915 aged 22. He was interred in the Green Hill Cemetery, Turkey. Leonard is one of twelve men from WW1 who are commemorated on the Lezant War Memorial at Landue. A further three men who fell in WW2 are also commemorated. PARISH TAXI SCHEME

FOR RESIDENTS OF LEZANT PARISH ONLY

The parish council subsidy for the taxi scheme is now £4 per trip, **return £4 each way**. The fares charged by Launceston Taxis are as below. **As a resident of Lezant Parish**, you are entitled to a subsidy of **£4.00** for any taxi journey at any time, so long as a taxi is available. To take advantage of the scheme the taxi must be pre-booked through Launceston Taxis on 07340 813434. The taxi driver will have a form that he will complete. You sign the form and pay the reduced rate to the driver. Please note that the single fares quoted below are for guidance only, if you live outside one of the villages the fare may differ slightly:

For example, a return journey from Treburley to Launceston will cost £12 in total. The Parish Council would encourage all residents to use the taxi whenever possible although it is appreciated that a taxi is not always available. Pre-booking the day before can sometimes help. **Remember, the taxi cannot be used on a regular basis for commuting between home and work, nor as a school-run vehicle.**

Dipping Sheep at Trekenner Farm- memories by Neil Burden.

For many years there was a legal requirement to manually dip all sheep at a designated place from the end of July into August, following a National Sheep Scab order to eradicate the disease in 1928. This statutory requirement meant the use of a noxious organochloride/phosphorous (OP) chemicals. These related Diazinon chemicals were banned worldwide by early 1990's. This at the time plus a disinfectant was the only effective means to kill sheep scab mite that lived in the ear of the sheep during the summer, who become active in the colder weather, showing up by intense irritation on the skin by blood sucking under the fleece. To ease the irritation sheep would constantly rub against fences and trees, their winter fleece damaged and the wool fell off. This also weakened the sheep and made the sheep vulnerable to death in severe weather. Sheep Scab is the earliest known infection in sheep, known by Moses and mentioned in Leviticus 22. To protect sheep in earlier centuries, farmers would dip sheep as routine using tar oil, arsenic, or tobacco strike happens in damp hot weather, blow flies/blue bottles would see the damp fleece as a good place to lay their eggs, then the maggots would suck blood from the sheep's skin.

For Lezant parish the annual dipping of sheep was at Trekenner Farm where the Daniel family lived and was overseen by the Parish Policeman. This was a monotonous task for Mr Daniel and his son Phil. The oblong dip was about 6ft deep, the size of a single bed and had a single safety rail, each sheep manually shoved in where they would bob around like seals, the sheep had to be saturated, the dip accommodating 3 adult sheep or 5 lambs. There was a wooden baffle on a hinge so the sheep had to stay in the deep area as the person in charge dunked each swimming animal with a wooden shaped T staff. After 3 minutes the pivoted baffle would be raised so the sheep could then walk up an incline to the small draining pen. Some dip would drain and return to the dip as they stood on a small concrete pad, even so the dip solution had to be frequently checked with a calibrated stick and water added plus even more chemicals.

This chore at Trekenner ran for 3 days, each flock being kept separate on the parish roads. Often a flock from the east of the parish would be followed by one from the west or north of the parish, some farmers having to walk these sheep 3 miles each way. For the larger flocks it would mean an all-morning task with an early start to arrive by 8.30 am, every sheep the farmer owned had to be dipped. The duty of the policeman watching was to make sure every dipped animal was totally immersed so that the dip solution went in the ears where those scab mites would be hiding. Getting the sheep to go down the rough lane to the dip required much shouting, barking dogs, and several helpers.

The older sheep knew the process and hated the smell of the dip, to say it was a bit of a pantomime is an understatement. There was often drama as some dipped sheep would panic and swallow some dip and turn turtle. Then a couple of brave strong men would try and get the animal out before it drowned, by it being thoroughly dipped by themselves, thus making it a bit of a spectator sport for the locals. The worst experience I had was a thunderstorm on the way home, the sheep all steaming and inhaling the fumes of the dip from those they were following, several sheep were dead the following day – seeing dead sheep inside the field gate the next morning and with a personal loss of voice and sore throat for many days brought that trek to Trekenner to an end. New methods were available to control diseases. Portable dips on a trailer visiting each farm by contractors using residual pyrethroid chemicals became the norm: it was easier to apply new residual chemical treatments for strike which are very effective and prevent the tiny maggots from shedding their skin when they hatch and hence die. Fly strike is something that shepherds dreaded in times past and even now a late Indian summer can still be a vulnerable time as the various treatments lose their effectiveness. Sadly, however many farmers have suffered greatly by dipping sheep with these now shown to be very dangerous chemicals. Many have been diagnosed with chronic disease like multiple sclerosis affecting the nervous system and severe depression. Much was written in the farming press over the years, debates in Parliament and denials that the chemicals were dangerous. To claim any compensation for those affected has been long and challenging.

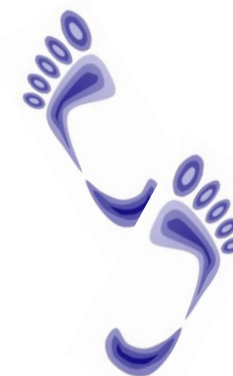

Recycling for Charity project updates

October has been an extremely busy month, we promoted the project at Duchy College Freshers Fair, Launceston Town Hall Fun Palace, Callington New Outlook group, Delaware Pre School, and have plans for more talks in November. It's great to see all ages recycling more.

We sent Terracycle **43 BOXES this month, that's 462 kg** of mainly crisps & snacks & biscuit packets, Pringles tubes, bread bags, cheese wrappers, sweet packets, tooth-paste tubes and brushes diverted from being binned and incinerated, which will now be processed and made into new products like benches, garden furniture, water-buts, kids toys etc. and raising funds for Kicks Count charity who aim to reduce UK still-births.

Plus a car full of CD's & DVD's was sent to Animal Free Research in Bude and we'll soon be sending off unwanted mobile phones, stamps, jewellery for Hill Pony Resources who have rescued ponies at Kelly Bray and around 60 ink jet cartridges which helps our project directly.

From the 1st of November the Pet Food programme is closing. The sponsors are no longer continuing this programme with Terracycle BUT you can take your pet pouches and flexible plastic pet food bags to TESCO stores and they will recycle them with carrier bags and other plastic packaging.



One programme closes and 2 others open. We can now accept Warburton's waxy bread bags and packaging from bread rolls, baps, bagels, crumpets, wraps, pittas, thins, brioche, croissants

The Recycling project trailer will be in **Launceston Tesco on TUESDAY November 2nd from 10:15 – 11:15am** then onto **South Petherwin** for 11:30am and **Coads Green** at 12 noon before heading back to **Golberdon** to box up. 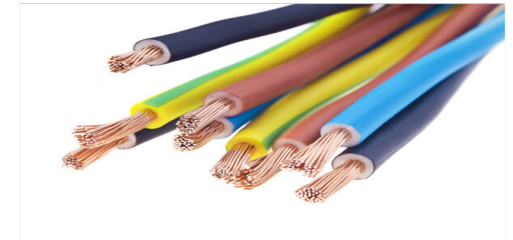
