### Fiona Barnes

We wanted to share some memories and thoughts that Rod, Nick, Dad and I have of an amazing sister and daughter Fiona who we tragically lost on the 19<sup>th</sup> March. I am sure that many of you will know her well or have met her walking around the lanes always with a warm welcome, a shared interest in the hedgerows, enjoying all weathers and often shoeless.

Fiona was Chris and Sue's second child and grew up initially on farms in Devon and Sussex before moving to Rose Cottage in Rezare 50 years ago. She belonged to the Sunday School and choir at Lezant Church and went to Trekkenner School. The family moved to Hillside in Treburley and then settled at Trekkenner Farm. Her love of nature and the world began then.

Fi had many different aspects to her life as she grew and developed over time. As a toddler she loved playing in the garden, often found sat in the flowerbed eating soil. This progressed to bare foot walking through the farmyard. She was supporting and following Greenpeace, in its infancy, and Amnesty International in her teens. She travelled to Egypt and India at 16 when those countries were very untouched and raw. She worked in catering as a teenager, cycling to the pub eight miles away for her first job and then going on to work at Appledore and Buckfastleigh. She went on to work at Devon County Council and was very instrumental in the P3 Parish Paths Partnership Scheme. She loved the family farm; the walk up the track to look at the moors, helping Dad in the polytunnel as the undergardener, watching yet another Doc Martin or Vera, dehydrating wild garlic and nettles in the Aga and the sound of the blender in the kitchen making up yet another green pesto, spending precious time with parents and siblings on her trips to Cornwall. She always proposed a toast and had an appropriate speech to make at our Christmas gatherings.

Aunty Fi's wise words have helped put things into perspective; her positive outlook on life, carefully written cards, much anticipated time spent with the nieces and nephews over the years. Her love for them and delight in their adventures will be with them for ever. Her biggest joy was motherhood, which she adored, she completely dedicated herself to parenting and saw this time as such a gift to provide Asha with the life skills, knowledge and ability to navigate her path in the world.

Fi had so many qualities that made her so very special:

Her passionate approach to life and its challenges, always giving 150% of herself.

Her love of nature; planting, growing, nurturing, preserving, honouring, educating and making changes to the world for future generations.

Her enjoyment in every sunset and sunrise, the change in seasons, new buds on the trees, foraging the hedges and welcoming the early morning birdsong.

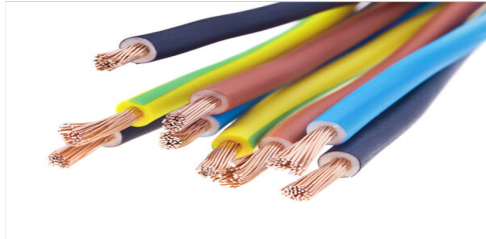

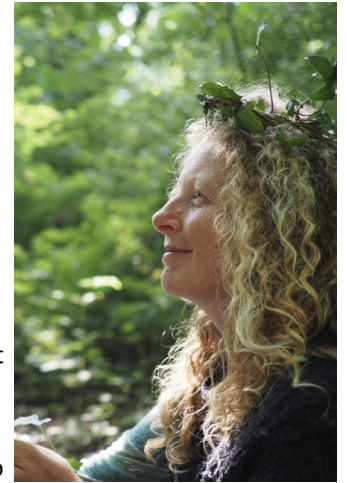

## Lezant WI

Members and guests of Lezant WI attended Trebulet Hall on the evening of Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> May for a most interesting presentation on Orangutan Rescue. Nigel Hicks, a retired local vet and his wife Sara set up their charity in 2009. The aim of the organisation is to rescue and treat orangutans affected by deforestation in South East Asia, mainly Borneo and Sumatra. To date they have managed to raise £250,000. There are three species of orangutan in the region. They mainly live a solitary life, living off termites and vegetation. Females only have an average of three offspring in their lifetime as the infants remain with their mother for six to eight years. The orangutans are being badly affected by the growing palm oil industry, which leads to massive deforestation.

The Rescue Centre rescues the Orangutan, they then get quarantined for three months and then move onto Baby School where they learn to play, from there they go onto Forest School. They learn to climb, build nests and they are 'dehumanized'. They then go onto their own islands and some stay permanently there as they are too disabled to fend for themselves. Nigel and Sara also set up the Bronwyn Watson Scholarship, so that local people native to South East Asia can be trained in the UK and then return to the Rescue Centre.

## PARISH TAXI SCHEME

### FOR RESIDENTS OF LEZANT PARISH ONLY

The parish council subsidy for the taxi scheme is now £4 per trip, **return £4 each way**. The fares charged by Launceston Taxis are as below. **As a resident of Lezant Parish**, you are entitled to a subsidy of **£4.00** for any taxi journey at any time, so long as a taxi is available. To take advantage of the scheme the taxi must be pre-booked through Launceston Taxis on 07340 813434. The taxi driver will have a form that he will complete. You sign the form and pay the reduced rate to the driver. Please note that the single fares quoted below are for guidance only, if you live outside one of the villages the fare may differ slightly:

Lezant £9.00	Subsidy £4.00	You pay £5.00
Tregada £9.00		You pay £5.00
Trekennor £10.00		You pay £6.00
Trekelland £9.00		You pay £5.00
Trebulet £10.00		You pay £6.00
Treburley £10.00		You pay £6.00
Rezare £10.50		You pay £6.50

For example, a return journey from Treburley to Launceston will cost £12 in total. The Parish Council would encourage all residents to use the taxi whenever possible although it is appreciated that a taxi is not always available. Pre-booking the day before can sometimes help. **Remember, the taxi cannot be used on a regular basis for commuting between home and work, nor as a school-run vehicle.**

## MARY CREW

28<sup>th</sup> August 1924 to 11<sup>th</sup> April 2022



Mary, her son Martin, granddaughter Janine and great granddaughter, Evelyn (the fifth of six great grandchildren).

Mary was born and raised in Kettering in 1924 and, no matter where her life took her, she always considered her roots to be in Northamptonshire.

Her son, Martin, was born in 1953 and Mary and Martin's father divorced a few years later. Mary then began working for United Counties Bus Company where she met her true love, Don. They married and were inseparable until Don died in 1991. In 1960 a work opportunity arose for them to emigrate to Ndola in Northern Rhodesia, soon moving on to Bulawayo in Southern Rhodesia (Zimbabwe). They both loved their life there and enjoyed a flamboyant and colourful lifestyle. Mary went onto discover her vocation in life when she started charity work, initially with the Garden Park Charity and Bulawayo Homes for The Aged, where she played a very active and important role. In her spare time, she enjoyed learning Yoga and after a few years she began to teach it. Over the years she received countless accolades from pupils of all ages that Mary and Yoga had changed their lives. Mary's suppleness at Yoga was renowned even in her late 80s and she continued to teach until after her 90<sup>th</sup> birthday when she retired - mainly because she couldn't get her leg behind her head anymore! Martin joined them in 1968. He moved back to the UK in 1974 and Mary and Don followed soon after when Don retired. Their first home on returning was in Wadebridge but within 2 years they discovered Trekenner where they lived for the rest of their lives.

Mary became a member of Lezant Parish Church, St Briochus, and in 1978 became Secretary of the Church Council and then was appointed a Churchwarden. "I'll try it for a year" she said. 23 years later her term of office came to an end. During this time, she served on the Deanery Synod, for some years as lay Chairman, also on the Diocesan Synod and the Bishop's Council. It was partly down to Mary's power of argument that there is still a Deanery of Trigg Major.



Mary and Don both joined Lezant Horticultural Society, Mary being involved for over 40 years. She became Secretary in about 1980 and then Chairman in 1995. Under her leadership the Society became one of the leading organisations in the parish with tremendous support from all the residents. The Annual Show is a highlight of the parish year and we so regret that Mary is not here to enjoy this year's show, being the first since 2019 due to Covid restrictions. The Society is continuing and we are sure it will continue to thrive in Mary's memory.

In late 1980 Mary began the Lezant Floral Art Group which flourished until 1985 when it ceased due to lack of support at that time. However, in 1993 Mary decided to revive the Group and this has been running successfully since then and will continue to do so. In 1999 the name was changed to Lezant Floral Art and Garden Group and then again more recently to Lezant Flower and Garden Group. Mary loved and excelled at floral art and was a great encourager to members to compete in the Horticultural Society Annual Show.

Mary received four awards for her community work. In 2005 she was nominated for the UK Honours List, this led to an invitation to a Summer Garden Party at Buckingham Palace in 2006. In 2013, Mary received a Cross of St Piran Award from the Bishop of Truro for her service and dedication to her Church. During the 40th Lezant Horticultural show in 2018, she received a Certificate of Appreciated from the Royal Horticultural Society for 40 years outstanding service to Lezant Show. Finally, in 2019, Mary received a Cornwall Council Civic Award for her contribution to community life.

Mary was a much loved mother, grandmother and great grandmother and friend to many but especially with her great friend, Rhona, who became a devoted lifelong companion who would do anything for her. Mary and Rhona would phone each other at least once a day, the 11am call being to check they were both still alive! Rhona says that when she thinks of Mary, three words come to mind, leadership, friendship and fun. The leadership was from her committees and yoga classes. Many members of those became her friends and most had felt the sharpness of her tongue if we didn't come up to her standards of perfection but the friendship was there and so was the fun. Her wicked sense of humour was a joy, she loved people and parties. There was always laughter when Mary appeared.

Mary's son, Martin, says that to describe his mother is impossible. He can only say she was inspirational with her humour, elegance, eloquence, and love of life and people. She was truly unique. Martin says her true epitaph will be "If there's a problem go and see Mary, she will sort it out".

Mary's funeral was held at her home church, St Briochus, in Lezant with a wonderful service led by Revd. Sean Clancy with the address given by Canon Tim Newcombe, a friend and fellow church colleague of Mary's. As expected the church was nearly full with the congregation singing the hymns chosen by Mary; she also chose the bible readings. A great send off for someone who will be sadly missed by so many.

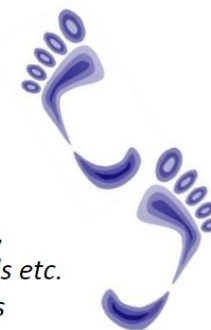

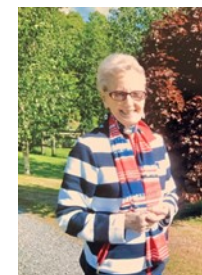
