

Trekelland Farmhouse The curious matter of the Bottle in the Wall

Cornwall has always been a county of ancient tradition and superstition. Sadly, the origins of many of these have been lost in the mists of time. One of these traditions, which is still sometimes evident today, was the tradition of warding off and protection from evil spirits and witches from the home.

Trekelland Farmhouse, which was built in the late 15th century, is located near the small hamlet of Little Comfort. It is one such building, which has through the course of its most recent renovation over the past three years, provided a remarkable wealth of evidence of past owners' attempts to protect their home and land from the effects of witchcraft and sorcery (such as the attempt to protect from ongoing illness within the family or protection against the possibility of failed harvests). So far, the discovery of certain occult marks on walls and ancient wooden beams have been uncovered. These marks will be described in a future article. The focus of this article will be 'the curious matter of the bottle in the wall'.

More recent evidence of 'witch protection' came to light a few weeks ago when Mr. Matthew Basire called in to see the completion of the most recent phase of renovation work on the farmhouse. Matthew was brought up in the farmhouse, from which his family ran a successful dairy farming business for many years. Prior to Matthew's father buying the farm in 1966, it was owned for many generations by the well-known Budge family.

The occasion was Matthew's first visit to the farmhouse since it was acquired by us approximately three years ago. Matthew still lives nearby and continues the family tradition of cattle farming. Whilst viewing the renovation work he asked "have you found the bottle in the wall yet?" At that state we had no knowledge of it. He then pointed to a stone wall next to an ancient wooden door. There before us, part buried in the wall, was the outline of a small bottle. It was most certainly there but we hadn't noticed it in the three years of our occupation. Matthew made a very valid point "Why would you?" Quite, who would expect to see a bottle deliberately half buried in a stone wall next to the large granite inglenook fireplace.

The bottle had been painted over with thick layers of limewash, which had built up over time. Matthew told us he remembers first seeing it as a little boy but did not know its purpose,

After undertaking research on these strange phenomena, an interesting picture began to emerge. Our research indicated that quite a few bottles have been found embedded in walls of ancient buildings. The earliest known reference was in a letter between two friends dated 1579. In that letter, the writer refers to an old woman near Norwich who he had visited and who, it was claimed, had been

"struck down by the power of witches". Her dutiful husband found a bottle and filled it with locks of her hair, pins and a secret potion which would help protect her from the curse. Stones were removed from the fireplace and the bottle was partly buried in the wall. It seems it was important that the contents of the bottle were visible, in case the witch should ever return.

Other examples of buried bottles were placed to try to counter the effects of a curse which the farmer believed had been placed on their livestock by a witch or wizard.

We decided to very carefully clean the side of the bottle of its coats of limewash and slowly uncovered what appeared to be its contents. There was a wooden stopper at one end to ensure that the contents remained within the bottle. The bottle was slightly green in colour and its contents seemed to be black hair, pins and a dried-up cream coloured liquid.

Our research on other 'bottles in walls' was written by academics, most of whom seem to suggest that the bottle should be left where it was buried, in recognition of local folklore. One academic suggested that it was not "wise to move it". In the interests of local folklore and 'superstition' we have decided to leave it where it is.

John Milne Home 5th September 1939 to June 2024

John and Veryan were both well known and well loved residents of the parish and did much to serve the community in the time they lived here. We will remember John with fondness.. These words are from Veryan.

John was born into a Naval family in 1939. In the 1950s his family bought a house in the Borders of Scotland and John went to school in Perthshire where he excelled at games and gym. At 19 he joined the Royal Marines and saw Service in Malta, the Middle East, Borneo and Singapore followed by five years serving with the Army on and around Salisbury Plain . On retirement he gained a Diploma in Business Management from Plymouth Polytechnic and started his civilian life working in Birmingham. He set up his own company in computer based training and stayed in that line of business until retirement in 1997, when he and Veryan moved to Cornwall.

John loved life in Lezant and joined the Parish Council, becoming Chairman in 2007 until he retired in 2011. He and Veryan ran a holiday cottage and through this he became involved in what was then a fairly new association, Tamar Valley Tourism Association (TAVATA), which connected all the different providers for the tourist industry in the Tamar Valley. He was Secretary of this organisation for several years and then became Chairman for some time. He also became Chairman of the South East Conservative Association, overseeing two elections. He loved meeting people and being involved in village life. He had a lifelong love of trees and the countryside. He and Veryan owned a wood near Horrabridge and he spent many happy hours cutting and sorting timber and managing the trees. Sadly he developed Parkinson's disease in his late 60s but didn't let that detract from his enjoyment of life, playing tennis until his mid 70's. In 2018 he and Veryan made the hard decision to leave St Lawrence and move to be nearer their children. They moved to Hampshire, where in late 2022 John was admitted to a care home where he died peacefully in June 2024.

LEZANT WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

At our September meeting, we had a lovely a most interesting talk by Peter Perkins and Andy Rogers from the Cornwall Seal Sanctuary. They told us about how the charity was set up 25 years ago in order to help the public understand the life of Grey Seals.

The seals mate and have one pup a year. They are born white and they remain white for about 3 weeks. Grey seals have been in decline for some years and, as a result, the charity conducts surveys from boats 3 or 4 times a year. The increase in the number of storms is a major factor in the seals' decline because hundreds of pups get separated from their mothers and so die of starvation. Warmer seas have resulted in earlier pupping, which largely coincides with the holiday season, and people on the beaches not understanding the implications of human presence for the seals. This is a peak time for seals being brought to the sanctuary. More seals are getting into trouble and need the charity's help through rescue, rehabilitation and, for the lucky ones, release. The charity also does up to 400 surveys a year with the help of Exeter University. Seals normally live for between 25 - 40 years. One of the biggest dangers for seals is fishing nets. They get caught up round seals' necks. Worse are the flying wheels used by fishermen, which cause a painful death. Another major problem is the increase in the amount of toxic algae blooms which release acid which affects the seal's nervous system. An influx of Common Seals, which are much bigger, moving slowly westwards from Devon is also causing problems for their grey counterparts. The main food for seals is Sand Eels and Bass. All in all, it was a lovely talk with numerous photos and, at times, we were spellbound so a big thank you to Pete and Andy and well done the Seal Sanctuary.

Apple filled Almond cake with a Cinnamon topping

(handy recipe with all the apples available this month. I have made this and can recommend)

7 inch spring form cake tin, buttered and lined. Pre heat your fan oven to 160C

4 oz SR flour

2 oz soft light brown sugar

2 oz ground almonds

3 oz butter

1 small egg, beaten

a teaspoonful or so of lemon juice

a few drops of almonds extract

In a small mixing bowl, mix together the flour, sugar and 1oz of the ground almonds then rub in the butter until it resembles breadcrumbs. Add the beaten egg and lemon juice and bring together. Tip into your prepared tin then sprinkle over the rest of the ground almonds.

1 lb of cooking apples,

3 oz soft light brown sugar

1 teaspoonful lemon juice

Note: I started off with a tad over 1lb of apples but by the time I had peeled and cored was left with 13 oz.

Peel and core the apples, then cut into slices. Place in a bowl, then toss with the sugar and lemon juice. Now tip the apples over the almonds mix.

2 oz SR Flour

5 oz soft dark brown sugar

1 teaspoonful ground cinnamon

2 oz butter

In a small bowl, mix together the flour, sugar and spice. Lightly rub in the butter and tip over the apples.

Bake for around 1 hour 15 mins, but turn down and cover if browning too much. Leave the cake in the tin to cool, then sprinkle over some icing sugar to serve if you wish.

(This is delicious either as a dessert or as a cake)

PARISH TAXI SCHEME—FOR RESIDENTS OF LEZANT PARISH ONLY

As a resident of Lezant Parish, you are entitled to a subsidy for any taxi journey using Launceston Taxis. (Please note: the taxi cannot be used on a regular basis for commuting between home and work, nor as a school-run vehicle.)

The current subsidy is £5 per single journey (you can also claim £5 for the return journey, if applicable). Please note this increase will be for a limited time only, it's hoped it may cover approximately 6 months. Once the grant is exhausted the subsidy will revert to £4. Please check the magazine for any updates or contact the clerk. To take advantage of the scheme the taxi must be pre-booked through Launceston Taxis on 07340 813434. The taxi driver will have a form that he will complete. You sign the form and pay the reduced rate to the driver. Please note that the single fares quoted below are for guidance only, and may differ slightly:
