Trekelland Farmhouse

Witch marks - Renovation discoveries

Historical Context:

We purchased the farmhouse along with two ancient barns approximately 3 years ago from a member of the Basire family, who, in turn bought the farmhouse, buildings and surrounding land in 1966. Prior to that, we were told that the Budge family held the farmhouse and land for many generations. We have however established that the Hockin family lived at the farm and farmed the land in 1911. Earlier still, in 1897, a Statement of Return, under the Agricultural Rates Act 1896, detailed the tenant farmer as William Tink, whilst the owner of the farm was C.G. Archer Esq. The total acreage at that time was 171.2 acres. Before the late 19th century there is no clear information as to who owned or farmed the farm, although we understand that it was owned at one stage by the church, and then the Robartes family.

It would be interesting to speculate which of the past owners or tenants had felt sufficiently concerned about the power of witches or evil spirits, that they felt it necessary to install some means of protection within their home.

Witch Marks 'Virgo Virginum' and Crescent moon:

Whilst renovating the first-floor room, which had been described as the 'old Granary', we began to clear off decades of lime wash from what turned out to be a wall constructed of solid slate stone panels. Each panel was approximately 3 inches thick, 6ft. high and 30 inches wide. Each slate is set into an oak surround. The slate wall runs across the full width of the farmhouse. In the top corner of one panel was a mark VV inverted. It had been carved deeply into the slate. We noticed, in addition, some strange crescent shaped marks on a roof beam, within the same proximity.

Thereafter, we spent some time researching the meanings behind both marks: **VV 'Virgo Virginum'**: According to academic research VV (where one v is joined to a second), is a well-known witch mark in both England and in early colonial USA. It represents the phrase 'Virgo Virginum' which means Virgin of Virgins (ie. the Virgin Mary). It was used from the 15th century until as late as the mid-18th century and was often carved into a wall or roof beam to protect the home from evil spirits. The marks were to provide the occupants of the farmhouse with a sanctuary from local, evil spirits, rather than other evil spirits which travelled through the night 'air', from place to place.

Crescent Moon marks: These marks, once carved, were supposed to address the issue of encouraging good health, not only for the farmer and his family but also his livestock. Again, the marks were supposed to be 'offensive' towards evil spirits and thus provided good protection for the home. They were also supposed to improve fertility within the family and farm animals, although the records are somewhat 'vague' as to its level of success. 'Crescent moon' signs have been found in some of the oldest buildings in the UK, making this mark one of the oldest of witch marks.

A Brief History of Plough Sunday

Plough Sunday is thought to be a very ancient festival, abandoned at the Reformation and then revived in the 19th Century. Traditionally it was celebrated on the first Sunday after Epiphany (which falls on 6 January). The next day, known as Plough Monday, marked the return to work after the Twelve Days of Christmas. In the medieval period, there was generally only one plough in each village (often kept in the church). This village plough would have been cleaned and decorated, and then dragged to the church to be blessed; and prayers would have been said for a good harvest before the start of the new season's work. During the service the 'plough light' was paraded ceremonially. This was a candle kept lit in the church throughout the year (but banned by Henry VIII in 1538).

After the blessing, the plough was pulled through the village again, led by a Fool and a boy dressed as a woman called a 'Betsy'. The procession stopped at as many ale houses as possible for revellers to demand drinks. Pennies were also collected from houses along the route as a contribution towards keeping the plough light going in the church throughout the year though some say this could have been to boost the kitty for ale at a celebration that evening. In a medieval precursor of 'trick or treat' it would appear that anyone not paying a penny was likely to find a furrow cut across their garden by morning! The day ended with a village feast, ale flowed, and the traditional centrepiece was always a large Plough Pudding. In Cornwall it is said that the revelry could involve 'guise dancing' during which the dancers would go into people's houses and turn the furniture upside-down.

Newspaper reports from the 19th Century indicate that these activities sometimes got out of hand. Here is an extract from the Derby Mercury in 1823:

"We have been requested to state, that in consequence of the outrage and disturbance occasioned of late years by Plough Bullocks, arising chiefly from their commencing their perambulations some hours before day light, it is the determination of the inhabitants of several of the parishes in the country who have been accustomed to entertain them, not to afford the slightest bounty or hospitality to such as on the ensuing Plough Monday, or on any future season, may visit them at untimely hours, or who may not conduct themselves in a peaceable and decorous manner."

On January 8th Malcolm Wright gave us a fascinating in depth talk about the late 18th and 19th century explorers who had searched indefatigably but mostly unsuccessfully for the source of the Nile. He covered early explorations of the other great rivers of Africa, the Zambesi, the Niger and the Congo, using slides to show us contemporaneous maps of Africa and showing paintings of the earlier explorers and—as time went by— early photographs. He included the famous meeting between David Livingstone and Henry Stanley, but shattered our illusions by saying that the words "Dr Livingstone I presume" were a later fabrication.

These European explorers displayed amazing fortitude and determination as they endured many hardships, including illnesses such as sleeping sickness and malaria, impossibly difficult terrain, wild animals and violence from native tribes. The Tsetse flies also killed their horses. Most of these early expeditions were undertaken with the aim of finding trading routes across Africa for the promotion of commerce.

The source was eventually deemed as being in Uganda's Lake Victoria, but, as Malcolm pointed out, can that actually be considered the case? What about all the rivers which flow into Lake Victoria itself?

After a cup of tea we drew the curtains to find it was snowing heavily. We closed the meeting early to enable members to drive back safely.

PARISH TAXI SCHEME—FOR RESIDENTS OF LEZANT PARISH ONLY

If you are a resident of Lezant Parish, you can claim a subsidy for any taxi journey using Launceston Taxis. (Please note: the taxi cannot be used on a regular basis for commuting between home and work, nor as a school-run vehicle.)

From 01 December 2024 the subsidy will be increased to £7 per single journey (you can also claim £7 for the return journey, if applicable). Please note this increase will be for a limited time only in order to use up reserves - once the grant is exhausted the subsidy will be lowered. Please check the magazine for any updates or contact the clerk. To take advantage of the scheme the taxi must be pre-booked through Launceston Taxis on 07340 813434. The taxi driver will have a form that he will complete. You sign the form and pay the reduced rate to the driver. Please note that the single fares quoted below are for guidance only, and may differ depending on where you are being picked up/ dropped off:

The Parish Council would encourage all residents to use the taxi whenever possible although it is appreciated that a taxi is not always available. Prebooking the day before can sometimes help.
